The Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) is effective as of 01/07/2022 (Effective date) to establish an affiliation by and between

Chakdaha College, Chakdaha, a West Bengal Government Aided undergraduate degree College with its office at Rabindra Nagar, P.O.- Chakdaha, Dist - Nadia, West Bengal (India), Pin - 741222, established in 1972 affiliated to University of Kalyani, hereinafter referred to as Chakdaha College and represented by its Principal, referred to as FIRST PARTY.

AND

Srikrishna College, a West Bengal Government Aided undergraduate Degree College with its office at Bagula, District - Nadia, West Bengal (India), Pin - 741502, established in 1950, hereinafter referred to as PC and represented by its Principal, referred to as SECOND PARTY, for the purpose of exchange of students, staff and faculty.

The aforesaid institutions are hereinafter referred to individually/ collectively as college/ colleges.

PREAMBLE

Whereas, Srikrishna College and Chakdaha College have many areas of common interest in Arts and Science, considerable advantage may be gained from their pursuit of academic excellence on a collaborative basis in the fields of scademics, pedagogy and research.

Now therefore, Chakdaha College and Srikrishna College have decided to enter into this Memorandum of Understanding (hereinafter referred to as MoU), which defines the framework for the cooperation of the two institutions in the following sections.

ARTICLE 1: OBJECT

Both colleges agree to develop the following collaborative activities in the academic areas of mutual interest, on the basis of equality and reciprocity.

The two institutions shall seek to promote:

A. Faculty/ Staff exchanges

- Each institutions will promote the exchange of faculty for the common UG Honours & Programmes Courses.
- Faculty exchange for the mutual benefit of both the institutions. (ii)
- Collaboration in teaching, research and development, and consultancy studies in the field of iiii mutual interest.
- Exchange of academic materials and publications. iv)
- Conducting lectures with the opportunity to teach or conduct research. v)
- Undertaking joint research wherever feasible. vi)
- Participating in seminars, workshops, symposin, other kinds of academic discussions. vii)
- Conducting study tours and joint consultancy work wherever feasible. viii)

A specific plan will be worked out for each activity and detailed arrangements for such collaborative work will be agreed upon.

B. Student Exchange

- a) Students in the exchange programme will be nominated by mutual agreement between the home and the host college.
- Exchange students may be evaluated by the host institution if such an evaluative framework for the academic interest of students be worked out; this will in no way impede or influence her/ his evaluation in home college or university assessment/ evaluation.

C. Other areas

- To exchange information and experiences on research and educational programmes
- To exchange information on teaching, learning material and other literature relevant to their educational
- c) To jointly organize seminars, faculty development programmes, workshops on topics of mutual interest
- and to invite each other's faculty to participate therein. d) To explore the provision of cultural and intellectual enrichment opportunities for staff, faculty and students of both institutes.
- To use library reading room facilities for a specified period. f) To use laboratory and I.T.C. facilities in specific cases (with prior approval of Principal) for a limited
- Exchange of N.T.S. for mutual understanding of college administration, exchange of experience and skill (viz. office management, student database management, Financial management &other I.T. uses etc.)

Chakdoha College and Srikrishaa College agree that detailed terms and conditions that guide each activity ntified above will be determined separately and agreed upon by the two colleges. These terms will include a

technical description of the proposed activity, financial arrangements and person(s) responsible for its implementation.

ARTICLE 2: COORDINATION

Each college shall appoint one member of its teaching faculty to coordinate& fast track the programme on behalf of the Principal of each college further, a Coordination Committee consisting of two Principals and the two Coordinators will periodically (once year) review and identify ways to strengthen cooperation between two colleges.

ARTICLE 3: CONFIDENTIAL INFORMATION

The two colleges will retain and respect individual confidentiality, including those pertaining to the collaborative activities of both colleges.

ARTICLE 4: INTELLECTUAL PROPERTY RIGHTS

Ownership of any intellectual property (including confidential information, know-how, patents, copyrights, design rights, rights relating to computer software and any other industrial or intellectual property rights) developed jointly during the course of this MoU shall be vested in both the colleges in this MoU. Both the colleges shall have right to determine the commercial implications, disposition and exploitation of such intellectual property and shall make joint applications for the registration of the same. Any publication regarding such intellectual property shall be possible with prior written consent of both colleges.

ARTICLE 5: VALIDITY

initially, the MoU shall remain in force for a period of Three (03) years commencing from the effective date. Institutions may extend the term by written agreement signed by both after review.

ARTICLE 6: TERMINATION

Either institution may terminate the MeU by giving written notice of One (01) month in advance to the other institution.

ARTICLE 7: LEGAL EFFECT

Nothing in this MoU shall be construed as creating any legal relationship between the two colleges. This Memorandum is a statement of intent to foster genuine and mutually beneficial collaboration.

ARTICLE 8: DISPUTE RESOLUTION

In case of a dispute relating to any aspect of academic cooperation, Principals of both colleges will jointly resolve the dispute in a spirit of independence, mutual respect and shared responsibility.

Srikrishna College and Chakdaha College welcome the establishment of this Memorandum for enoperation and jointly agree to the provisions set out as above.

The College provides excellent research ambience with 9 research departments and adequate research infrastructure. St. Thomas College, Thrissur, hereinafter referred to as ("STCT") and shall include its lawful representatives and permitted assigns of the second part.

(SKC and STCT hereinafter referred to singularly as "the Party" and collectively as, "the Parties")

WHEREAS

A. The Parties are desirous of entering into this MoU to declare their respective intentions and to establish a basis of co-operation and collaboration between the parties upon the terms as contained herein.

SKC AND STCT HAVE REACHED AN UNDERSTANDING AS FOLLOWS:

1. OBJECTIVE

The Parties, subject to the terms of this MoU and the laws, rules, regulations and national policies from time to time in force in each party's country, will endeavour to strengthen, promote and develop cooperation between the parties on the basis of equality and mutual benefit.

2. AREAS OF CO-OPERATION

- 2.1Each Party will, subject to the laws, rules, regulations and national policies from time to time in force, governing the subject matter, endeavour to take the necessary steps to encourage and promote co-operation in the following areas:
- a) Enrichment Programs/Conferences
- b) Exchange of faculty
- c) Jointly organize international conferences; and
- d) Any other areas of co-operation to be mutually agreed upon by the Parties from time to time.

3. FINANCIAL ARRANGEMENTS

- 3.1 This MoU will not give rise to any financial obligation by one Party to the other.
- 3.2 Each party will bear its own cost and expenses in the implementation of this MoU.
- 4. CONFIDENTIALITY
- 4.1 Each Party shall undertake to observe the secrecy of confidential information received from or supplied to the other Parties during the period of implementation of this MoU or other agreements made pursuant to this MoU.
- 4.2 All Parties agree that the provisions of this Clause shall continue to be binding between the Parties notwithstanding the termination of this MoU.
- 5. INTELLECTUAL PROPERTY RIGHTS
- 5.1 The intellectual property rights shall be enforced in conformity with the respective national laws, rules 'and regulations of the Parties and with other international agreements signed by both Parties.

This MoU serves only as a record of the Parties' intentions and does not constitute, and is not intended to constitute or create, obligations under domestic or international law and will not give rise to any legal process and will not be deemed to constitute or create any legally binding or enforceable obligations, express or implied.

7. NO AGENCY

Nothing contained herein shall be construed so as to constitute a joint venture partnership or formal business organization of any kind between the parties or so to constitute either Party as the agent of the other.

8. ENTRY INTO EFFECT AND DURATION

- 8.1 This MoU will come into effect on the date of signing and will remain in effect for a period of three (3) years.
- 8.2 This MoU may be extended for a further period as may be agreed in writing by the Parties.

SETTLEMENT OF DISPUTES

Any difference or disputes between the Parties concerning the interpretation and/or implementation and/or application of any of the provisions of this MoU shall be settled amicably through mutual consultation and/or negotiations between the Parties without reference to any third party or international tribunal.

- The host organization (SRIKRISHNA COLLEGE- BAGULA) will Promote HVYI Academic and other Yoga Programs using various available resources locally and HVY1 will utilize the same from the host organization.
- Recommend the name of the Coordinator.
- Give 1 or 2 rooms with a hall, space of approximately 45-50 sq. m. for the office of Coordinator and HVYI yoga activities.
- Install the signboard of HVYI Centre as per the prototype sent by HVYI prominently at a proper place in the institution/Organization.
- Make halls/rooms and other resources available for holding counselling, practical
 and term -end examinations as per the HVYI norms.
- Extend learning facilities to the learners and yoga participants of hvyi for given program(s).
- For the residential yoga programs; both the parties should have a mutual financial understanding to provide all the facilities, such as good satvik food,

accommodation, electricity, water supply (hot & cold) including drinking water for all the participants.

10. Cleanliness and hygiene of the entire campus, food and accommodation to be

maintained properly.

11. Arrange schedule of Academic, therapeutic and regular yoga practical interaction of yoga teachers & Counsellors with the learners for both theory and Practical's.

12. If the location is out of the city, local transportation from the railway station/ airport/bus stop has to be arranged during the visit of HVYI Yoga experts.

13. Local security, protection from wild animals and in case of health emergency during stay of every participant; necessary steps to be taken.

14. Take all necessary steps as are needed to support HVYI Programs, for all practical purposes, coordinator of host institution will be accountable for managing the center on behalf of HVYI Or its own.

 The organization will receive funds as per the financial understanding with HVYI and Associate organization.

- 16. HVYI will Provide all the technical supports to run yoga academic courses and other yoga related programs at the premises of hosting organization or any said location by deputing competent teachers and staffs
- 17. Salary of the teachers and staffs deputed by HVYI will be provided by HVYI including their travelling expenses from their respective places and return journey.
- 18. Provide instructional and Audio-Video materials pertaining to the program(s) activated at the yoga activity center along with Yoga Kit(s) including course material for handling Support Services for students.
- 19. Both the parties shall have the right to shift / terminate the Program or MOU if both the parties find that support Services from both sides are not being provided as per the requirements of the program/s.
- 20. In such case of termination of the MOU both the parties would have to hand over all the assets and academic records to the respective parties whom it belongs to.
- 21. Both the designated person will also have to settle all the financial accounts with both the parties.
- 22. Any dispute/s arising of this MOU is subject to the jurisdiction of the courts in Kolkata division only.
- 23. All the accounts of the specific programs and activities at the centre will be open and transparent to both the parties.

24. All the collected amounts in the form of fees or donations for the specific programs or yoga activities from yoga students or yoga participants will be shared in 50% (SRIKRISHNA COLLEGE- BAGULA) & 50% (HVYI) ratio among both the parties.

25. In case of conducting all the programs at HVYI CAMPUS and whole responsibilities goes to HVYI, only, as per enrollment of students SRIKRISHNA COLLEGE- BAGULA, 30% of their collected fees will be

shared with SRIKRISHNA COLLEGE-BAGULA.

26. Fees of the respective courses and programs have to be designed by the concern of both parties and it has to be signed by both the parties after the finalization of those courses and programs.

27. The yoga courses and different module of short yoga programs are starting from

minimum of one day stay to more than 3 months.

Expenditure related to course material will be provided by HVYI.

29. Any unwanted happening or unlawful act at the centre will be solved by both the

parties; sitting together.

30. This memorandum of understanding will be effective upon signature by the below authorized officials for the tenure of THREE YEAR year and it may renew as per demand of both parties.

And

Srikrishna College (Affilitated To University of Kalyani), Baguta, Nadia, West Bengal, India. hereinafter referred as Srikrishna College represented by its Principal /Registrar/Director/Dean/ HOD/Vice Chancellor

This MOU witnesses as under-

- Wherens the main objective of the CSU is to promote, develop, propagate disseminate and preserve Sanskrit in all its aspects through any accepted mode, including Sanskrit learning under its Non Formal Sanskrit Education (NFSE) activity.
- 2. And whereas for implementing its NFSE activity, the CSU makes collaborations with the Universities, Colleges, Institutions etc. desirous of promoting Sanskrit learning to its students/staff and general public within its reach, through NFSE Centre along with other similar academic activities at their organisation.
- And whereas, pursuant to the proposal submitted by <u>Srikrishnu College (SKC)</u>, for running of NFSE Centre, the CSU intends to collaborate with it for opening of the NFSE Centre in its premises and sign the MOU therefore.
- 4. And whereas, the CSU will provide the following facilities, arrangements and material for conducting the prescribed courses in this NFSE Centre-
 - a. Trained Sanskrit Teacher.
 - b. Prescribed monthly remuneration to be paid by CSU. (In addition to his duties in the allotted Centre, he may be required to teach the learners at any other nearby Centre/Centres if required).
 - Reading material for the learners
 - d. Prescribed guidelines for NFSE
 - e. Conducting examination at the end of academic session and awarding certificate/diploma to the successful candidates.

And whereas, the CSU will undertake Sanskrit education for Certificate Course in Sanskrit Language and Diploma in Sanskrit language of the duration of one year each for the learners in NFSE Centre. Learners enrolled in the Centre will be required to deposit prescribed Registration fee to the CSU.

- And whereas <u>Srikrishna College</u> will provide the facilities and extend support as under
 - a. Suitable arrangements for functioning of NFSE Centre, including senting arrangements, infrastructure, electricity etc.
 - Nominating a faculty member as authorised officer to coordinate functioning of the Centre. He will be required to ensure that the courses are conducted as per the provisions prescribed in the guidelines for NFSE.
 - Publicising the Sanskrit learning courses of CSU in non formal mode and also making arrangement of the same at its Centre.

- 7. And whereas in any matter concerning the NFSE Centre or any issue arising in conducting the courses, the same will be resolved jointly by the authorised officers of CSU and SKC.
- 8. This MOU will be valid initially for one academic session and may be extended mutually. Now, therefore, in witness whereof, this MOU is executed and signed by the officers of CSU and SKC


