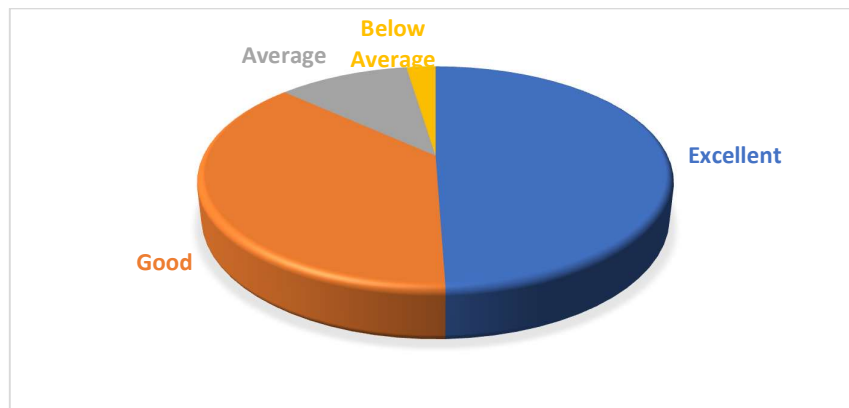

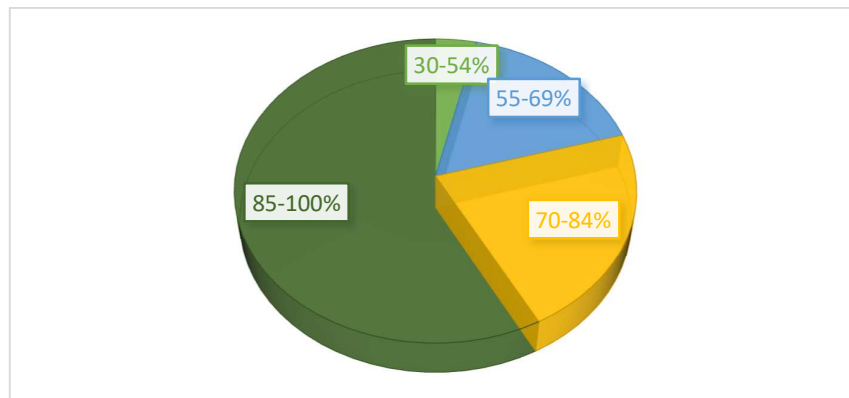
#### 1. How do you rate about admission procedure?

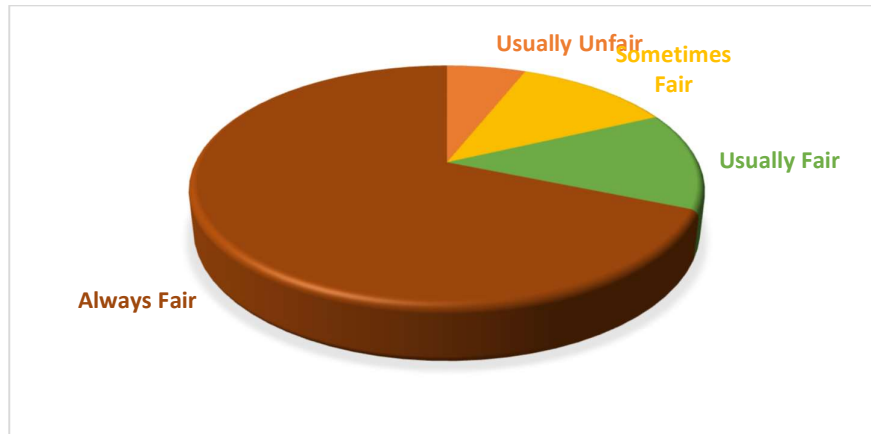
#### 2. How much of the syllabus was covered in the class?

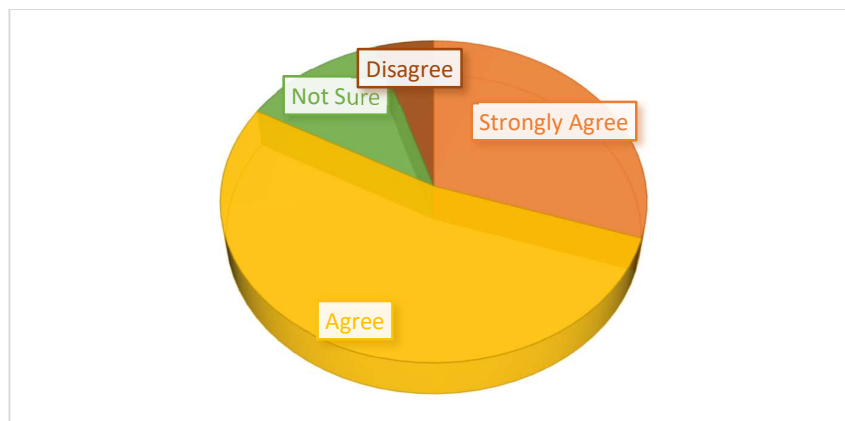

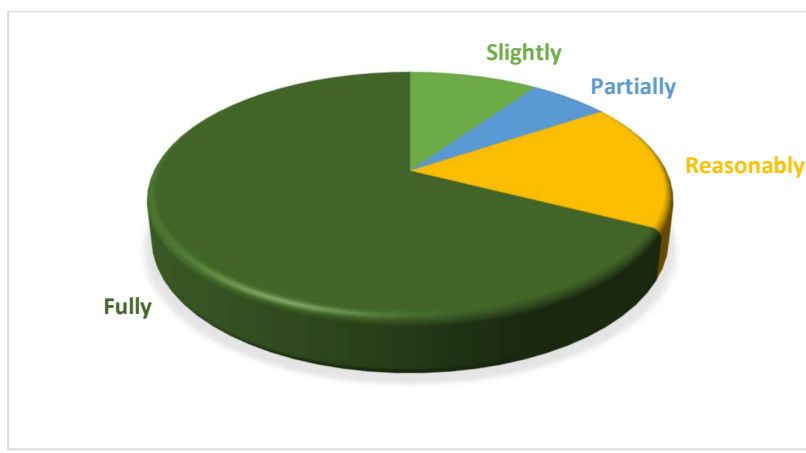
### 4. The institutions provide multiple opportunities to learn and grow-

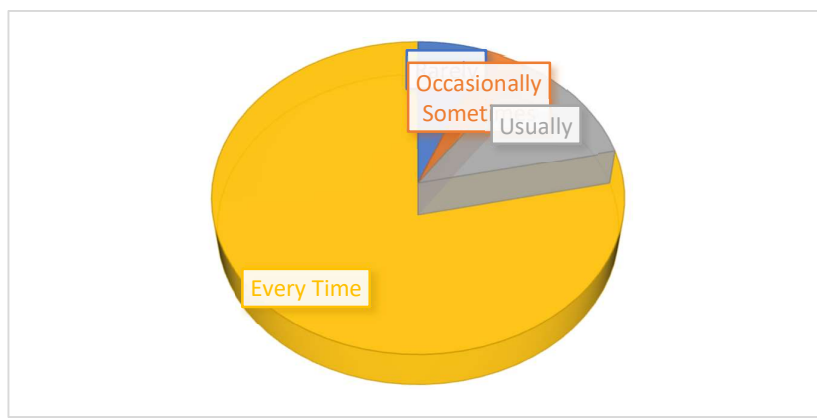
### 5. The teachers identify your strength and encourage you with providing

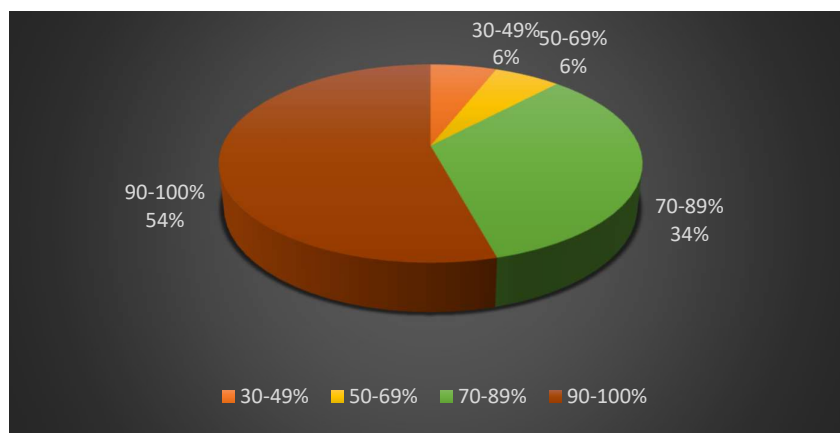
#### 6. Teachers are able to identify your weakness and help you to overcome

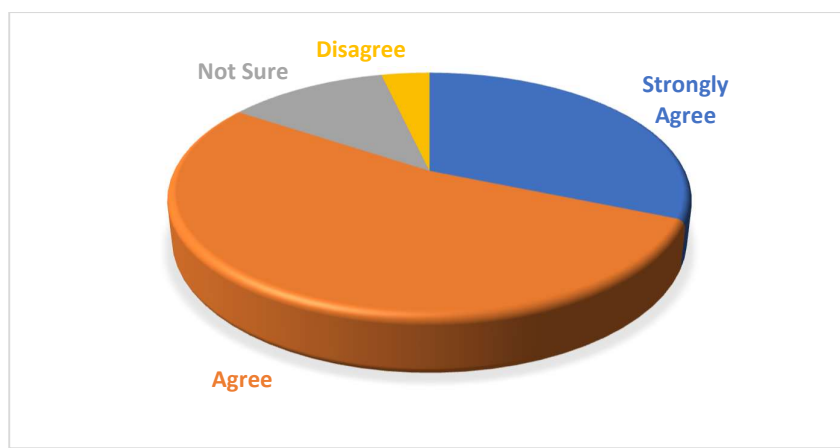
#### 7. What percentage of teachers use ICT?

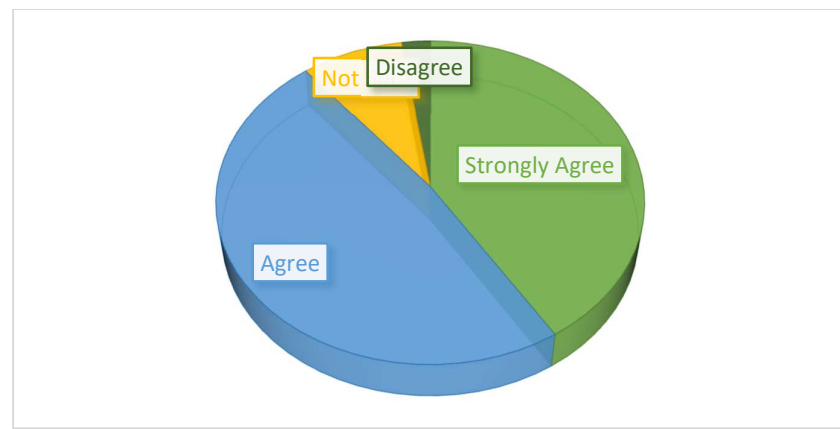

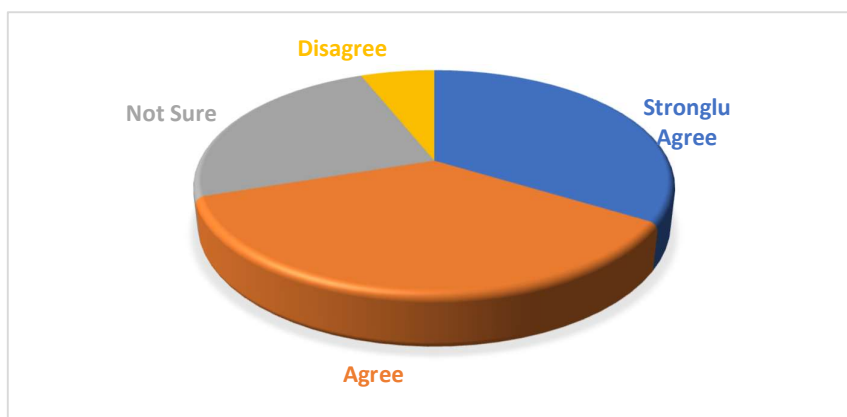
### 9. Availability of books and internet facility provided in the library is

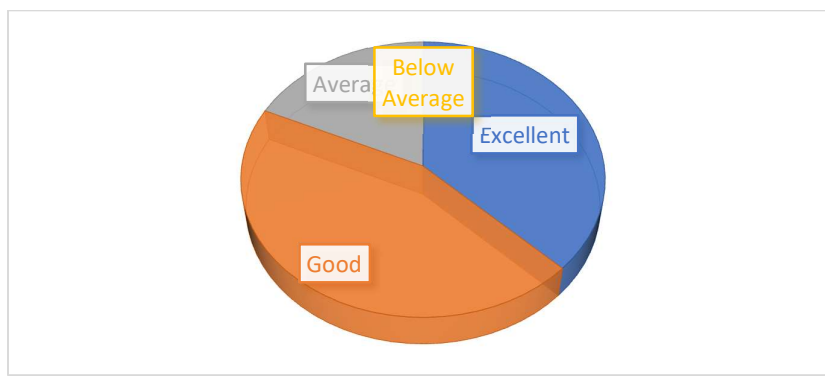


**10. Equipment in the Lab(s) are in good working conditions-**

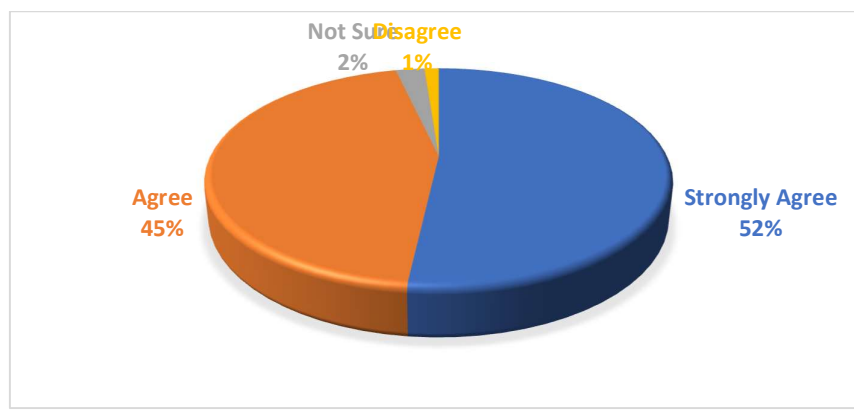

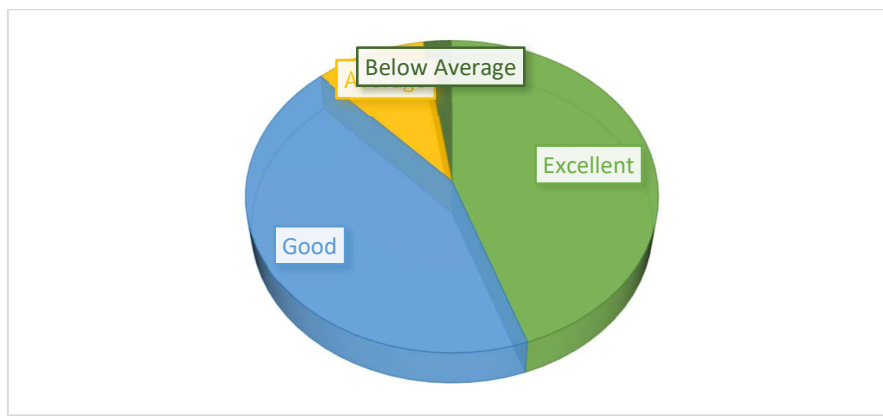
**12. The Campus is green and Eco-friendly-**

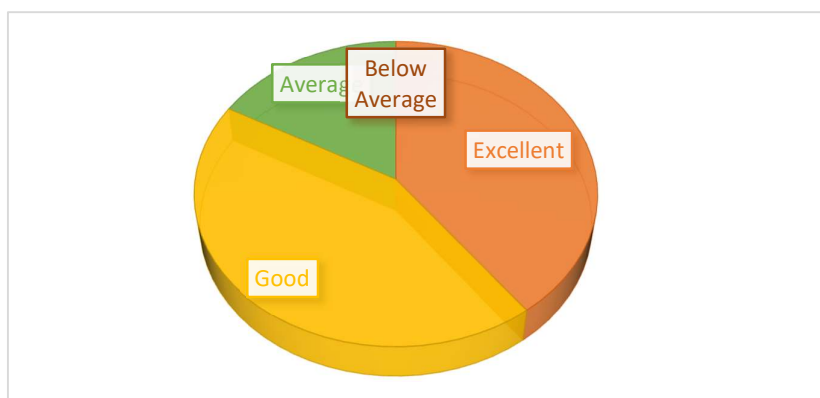
### 13. How do you rate about the administration of the College?

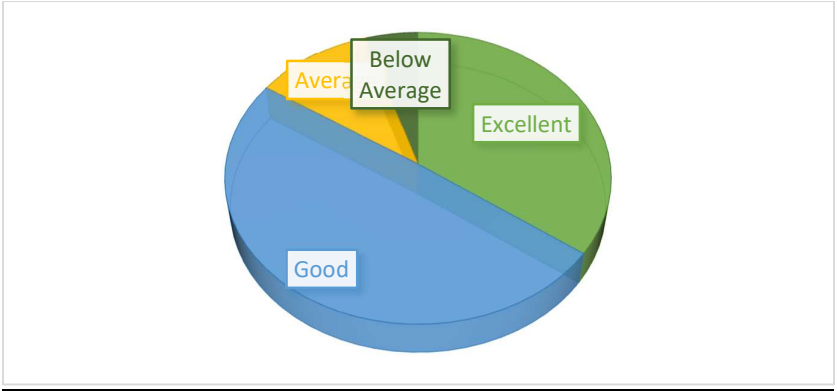
### 14. How do you rate about college infrastructure?

## **Students' Feedback Analysis Report (2024-25)**

### **1. Explicit General Observation & Report**

The student feedback (332 responses) reflects strong overall satisfaction, highlighting the institution's academic quality, teacher engagement, and eco-friendly environment. Over 80% of respondents rated most parameters as "Excellent" or "Good." Major strengths include campus sustainability (96.4%), faculty responsiveness (90.3%), ICT-integrated teaching (87.9%), library resources (89.2%), administrative support (88%), and fair internal evaluation (82%). Students acknowledged teachers' ability to recognize individual strengths and weaknesses (84.4%) and expressed confidence in admission and office services. The data demonstrates a cohesive academic environment supported by effective faculty and digital teaching practices.

### **2. Areas Needing Improvement**

Despite high satisfaction, several operational and experiential gaps emerged:

- A. Laboratory Equipment: Only 69.1% agreed that labs were well equipped; nearly one-third were unsure or dissatisfied.
- B. Syllabus Coverage: 20.5% reported coverage below 70%, signalling inconsistency in teaching completion.
- C. Extra-Curricular Activities: 22.1% found this only average or lacking diversity.
- D. Infrastructure & Facilities: 16.8% rated campus amenities (sanitation, canteen, common rooms) as average or below.
- E. Evaluation Fairness: 18% expressed partial dissatisfaction, suggesting uneven assessment experiences.

These areas represent critical service and perception gaps that can directly influence student satisfaction and institutional credibility.

### **3. Suggested Actions**

#### **A. Laboratory Equipment**

- Step: Conduct a comprehensive lab audit to identify missing or nonfunctional equipment.
- Short-Term (0–6 mo): Repair high-use items and share updated equipment lists.
- Long-Term (6–12 mo): Plan phased modernization through institutional funding or alumni/industry sponsorship.
- KEY PERFORMANCE INDICATOR: Raise satisfaction to  $\geq 90\%$  within a year.

#### **B. Syllabus Coverage**

- Step: Introduce weekly progress tracking for each subject.
- Short-Term: Schedule remedial and bridge classes for incomplete modules.
- Long-Term: Adopt blended learning and periodic teaching audits to ensure 100% coverage.
- KEY PERFORMANCE INDICATOR: Increase reported full-coverage responses from 79.5% to  $\geq 95\%$ .

#### **C. Extra-Curricular Activities**

- Step: Reassess club offerings through a student interest survey.
- Short-Term: Relaunch two popular clubs and host monthly activities.
- Long-Term: Institutionalize activity credits and inter-college competitions.
- KEY PERFORMANCE INDICATOR: Boost participation by 30% and raise satisfaction to  $\geq 88\%$ .

#### **D. Infrastructure & Facilities**

- Step: Conduct a quick facility audit focusing on cleanliness, water, and seating.
- Short-Term: Implement visible cleanliness drives and repair common areas.
- Long-Term: Budget for modernization and create a digital complaint system.
- KEY PERFORMANCE INDICATOR: Elevate satisfaction to  $\geq 92\%$  within 12 months.



#### **E. Evaluation Fairness**

- Step: Develop standard rubrics and publish grading criteria.
- Short-Term: Train faculty on objective evaluation and collect anonymous feedback.
- Long-Term: Introduce moderation and appeal procedures.
- KEY PERFORMANCE INDICATOR: Reduce dissatisfaction by 50% and achieve  $\geq 90\%$  fairness perception.

#### **4. Scope for Additional Improvement**

- Digital Enhancement: Expand ICT usage with interactive platforms and e-content repositories.
- Sustainability Projects: Use the 96% eco-friendly approval to launch student-led green initiatives.
- Wellness Programs: Introduce mental health and career counselling sessions for holistic growth.
- Student Participation: Create student ambassador programs for peer support and feedback communication.
- Real-Time Monitoring: Implement quarterly micro-surveys to measure progress across initiatives.

#### **5. Overall Conclusion**

Students view the college as academically strong and well-managed, with notable confidence in teaching quality and digital integration. Strengthening laboratories, ensuring full syllabus coverage, diversifying co-curriculars, and improving infrastructure will elevate the student experience. Short-term operational fixes coupled with structured long-term reforms will enhance satisfaction, trust, and institutional reputation—positioning the college for sustained excellence and student success.
