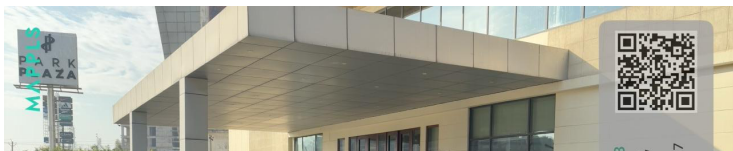



REPORT ON THE WORKSHOP: "BUSINESS COMMUNICATION SKILLS"

The Career Development Counseling & Placement Cell of Jangipur College, Kandi Raj College, Srikrishna College Bagula, and Kanchrapara College successfully organized a workshop on "Business Communication Skills" on March 20, 2025, at 12:00 Noon in a blended mode. This event was a part of the broader initiative, "An Initiative to Bridge the Gap Between Industry & Academia (Part-2)," aimed at preparing students for professional challenges by enhancing their communication skills. The primary focus of the workshop was to develop interview skills, with a special emphasis on the self-introduction segment, which plays a crucial role in making a strong first impression during job interviews. The session was conducted by Ms. Sreemayee Chakrabarty, Assistant General Manager, Talent Development Team (TD-LDP), Tata Consultancy Services (TCS).

Ms. Chakrabarty shared valuable insights into the essentials of effective self-introduction, articulation, voice modulation, body language, and confidence-building techniques. She guided participants on crafting a structured self-introduction that highlights their strengths, skills, and career aspirations. The workshop featured mock interviews, where students practiced introducing themselves, followed by real-time feedback from the expert. This hands-on approach helped students identify their strengths and areas that needed improvement, making them more confident and interview-ready. Ms. Chakrabarty also emphasized the importance of clarity, conciseness, and professionalism while introducing oneself in professional settings.

A key highlight of the workshop was the interactive discussion on overcoming nervousness and mastering non-verbal communication. Ms. Chakrabarty provided tips on maintaining eye contact, using appropriate gestures, and structuring responses based on different job roles and industries. She also addressed the challenges of virtual interviews, guiding students on how to create a strong presence in online meetings. The session allowed participants to ask questions and receive personalized guidance on improving their interview performance. The blend of theory and practical exercises made the workshop engaging and highly beneficial for all attendees. A total of 52 students from Srikrishna college attended the program.



The workshop received an overwhelmingly positive response from students, faculty members. Many participants expressed that the session boosted their confidence and prepared them for upcoming job interviews. The Career Development Counseling & Placement Cell reaffirmed its commitment to organizing similar skill-enhancement programs in the future to ensure students are well-equipped for the transition from academia to industry. This initiative successfully bridged the gap between theoretical knowledge and practical industry expectations, empowering students with the essential communication skills needed for career success.

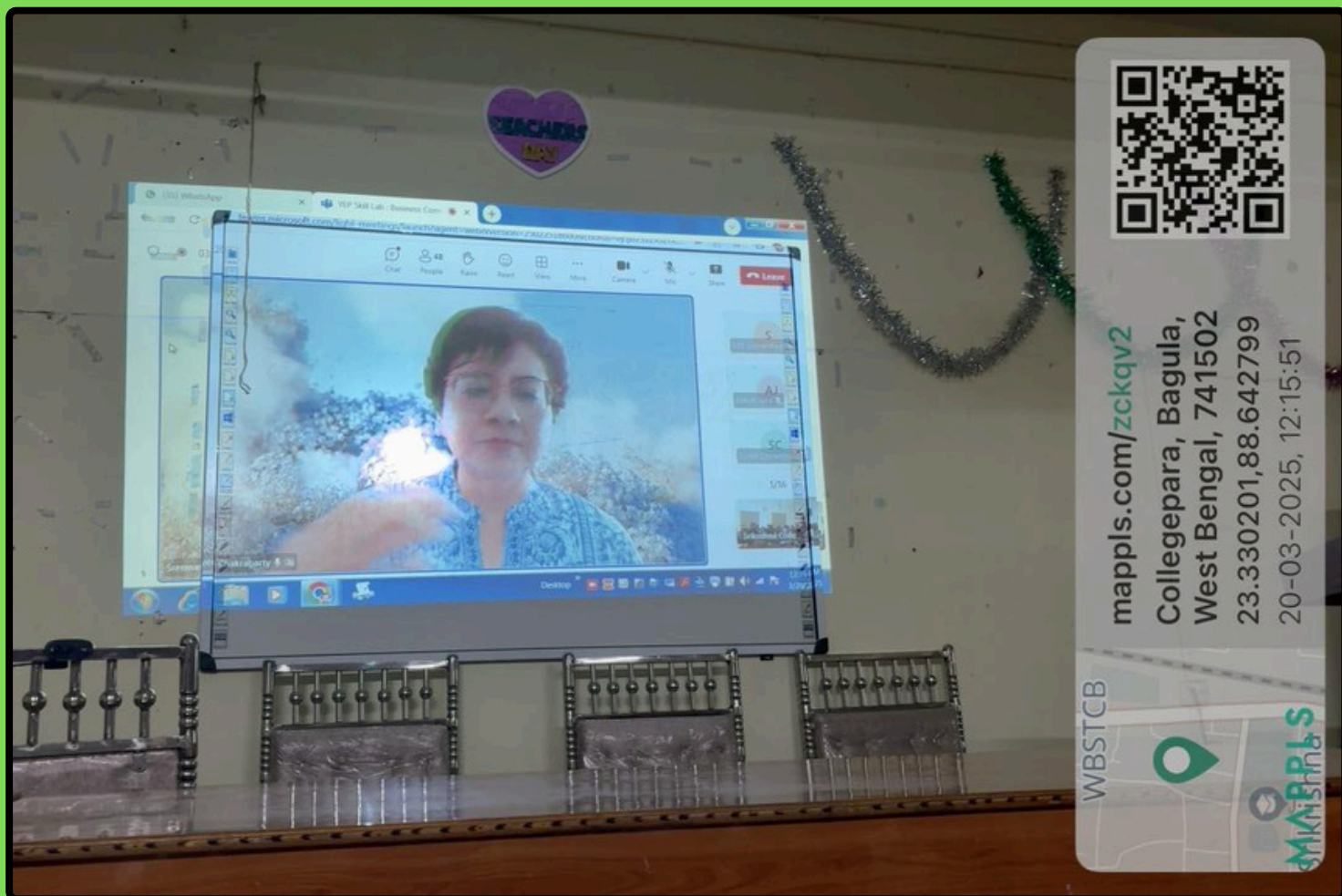

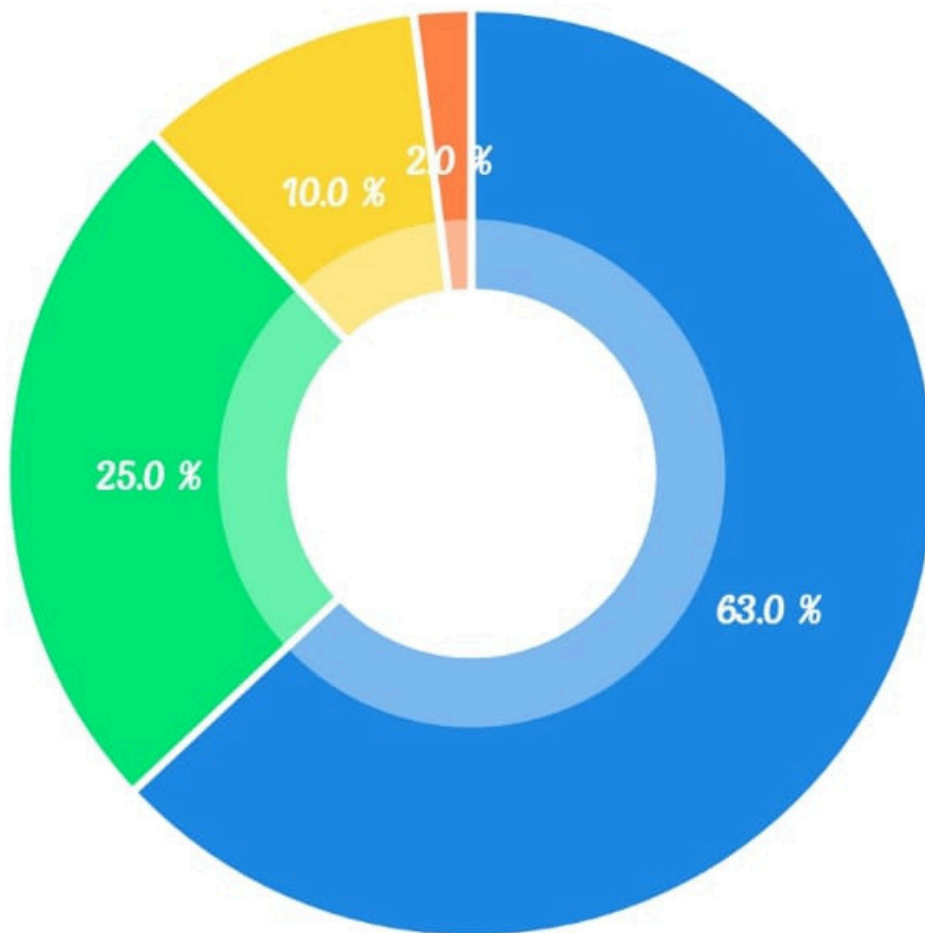

- d) Not relevant - 2

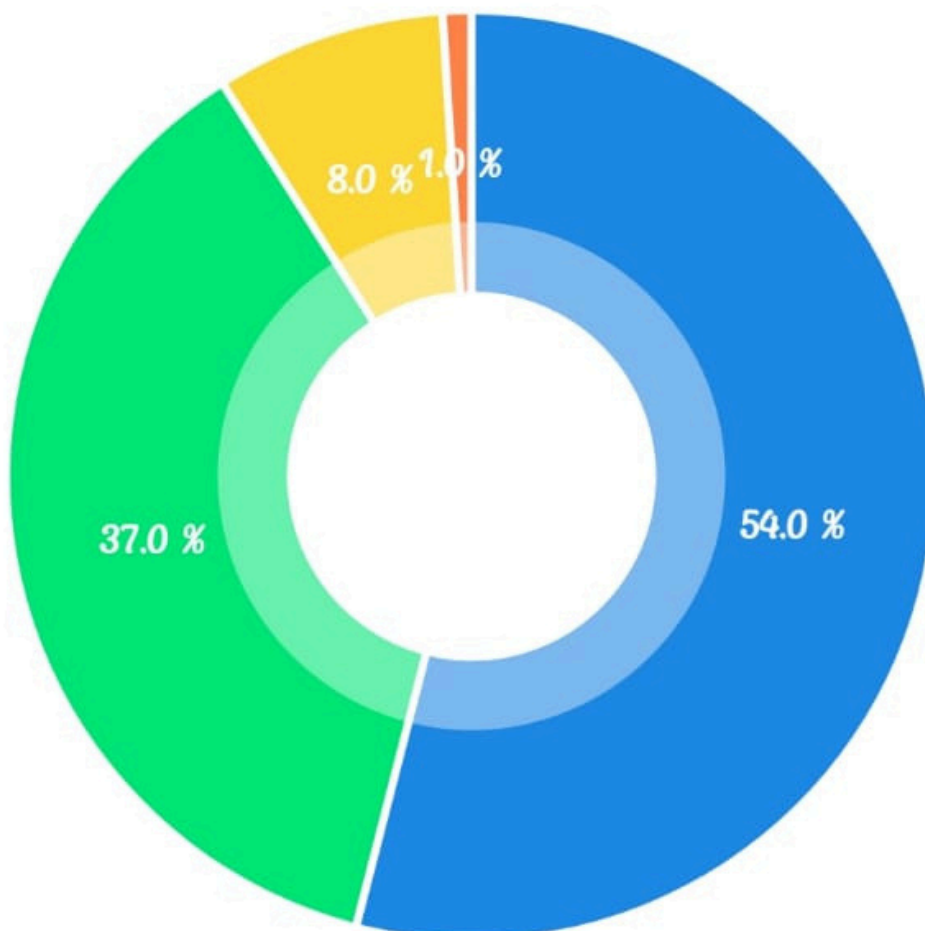

- Job Description: Responsible for picking and packing grocery items.

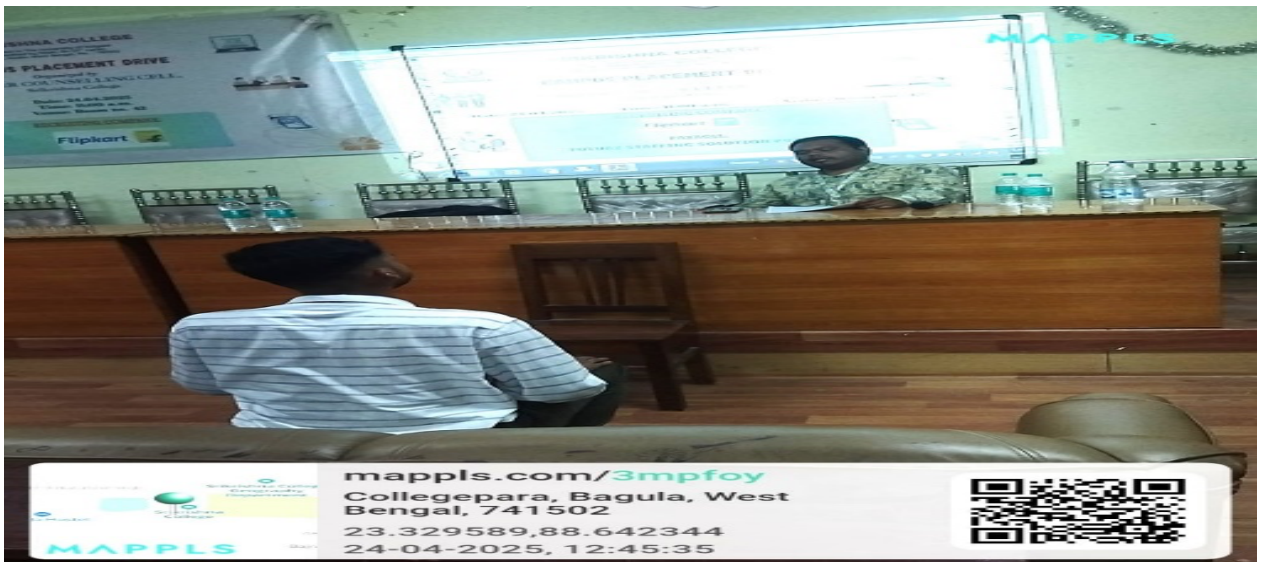
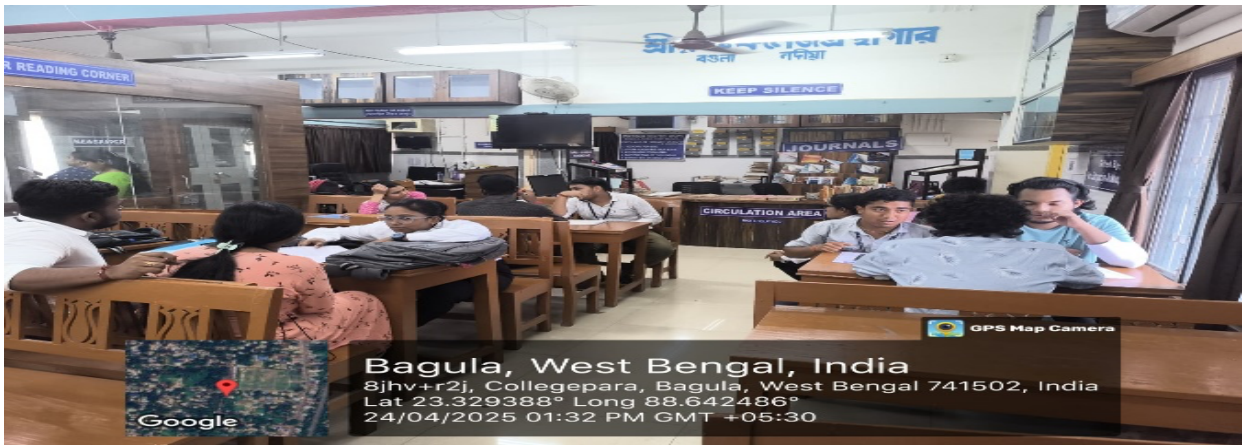
Programme Highlights:
